- Mr. Castano asked for assistance regarding speeding cars on Reba Road; Lieutenant Licata was present and offered to speak with Mr. Castano after the meeting.

Paula Danchuk, 50 Elizabeth Way:

- Ms. Danchuk stated the writing on the road on Orben Drive has helped the speeding problem, she questioned the resolution regarding the Borough Administrator's retirement and re-hire, spoke about the reforestation grant, questioned the withdrawal of the new OPRA ordinance and asked the status of the sign ordinance.

Nancy Absalon, 15 Oak Street:

- Ms. Absalon asked if the Lake Hopatcong Yacht Club events will affect parking on the island, questioned the resolutions regarding surplus sales, asked about the project in Resolution 2010-79 (Howard Boulevard Village Center Roadway Improvement Project), questioned the procedure on receiving grant money and questioned Resolution 2010-81 regarding estimated tax bills.

### 1. Council Comments.

- Councilman Windish, Liaison to Recreation Committee: The Committee has expanded the soccer program to include 3 year olds; this is a self sustaining program, with no cost to the community; the adult basketball program was also approved, at the courts behind the old library building, and is also a self-sustaining program.

- Councilman Sorge is working on a program to conduct tours for senior citizens and asked Council's advice on implementing a \$7.00 charge for the tour, \$5 donation to the Historical Society and \$2 to the Borough for use of van, etc. Also, the Historical Society will give a power point presentation at the Civic Center before or after the tour.

- Councilman Sorge attended the Fourth of July fireworks at the beach and noted that people with animals are not allowed on the beach; he was disappointed the ordinance was not enforced.

### 2. Dunlap Street

- The Mayor stated there is a resolution on tonight's agenda allowing us to go out for bid on a project nearby Dunlap Street, wherein Dunlap water will be included in the project; no new money is being spent. Councilman Sadow stated that this issue was brought up at the last Council meeting and, now, one month later, the water issue is being resolved.

### 3. Ice Retardant Systems

- The Mayor stated that people are having problems trying to keep ice away from docks. We have two sample ordinances from Hopatcong Borough and Jefferson and a letter from the Construction Official who reviewed both and made recommendations. The Mayor asked that the ordinance be introduced in early September to make people aware of the changes before the winter. The Mayor stated this is a safety issue, every year the lake is drawn down 26 inches and every 5 years it goes down 60 inches. The Mayor described the difference between bubblers and ice eaters and their safety features.

Mayor report for 7/6/10

Since our meeting on 5/4/10:

Due to a change in my appointment calendar, my report will contain less information than usual. Some of my information was lost with my transition of work electronic record containment. I wanted to thank everyone for their support in the primary election.

6/17/10- I had the chance to meet with Governor Christies staff as a member of the Executive Board of the NJ League of Municipalities in Trenton to discuss the 2.5 cap initiative and to express our collective concerns about the proposal. Many of our concerns were discussed and there was an agreement to bring these concerns to the Governor and get back to us. Just today I was asked to participate in a conference call this Thursday to discuss the plan that was negotiated this past weekend.

The next day I signed onto the 2.5 pledge and was the 201<sup>st</sup> Mayor to do so. Included with my pledge was a 2 ½ page letter expressing my concerns about how this could negatively affect Mount Arlington.

6/21/10- Chaired my last Lake Hopatcong Commission meeting. I certainly enjoyed being afforded the privilege to serve in that capacity for 5 1/32 years. I wish more could have been accomplished during that time but funding was always the number one issue that took much of my time. I wish Mayor Felter the best as the new chair and hope to see

the Commission thrive in the future since it is Lake Hopatcong that benefits. The protection and enhancement of Lake Hopatcong was always my primary mission since it is so important to me personally and for Mount Arlington as a whole.

June 23, 2010- I attended the Mount Arlington 8<sup>th</sup> grade graduation ceremony and was afforded the opportunity to address the graduating class. The summation of my words, outside of congratulating them for their accomplishment, was to remind them that life is all about people and relationships.

Immediately following the graduation I came to Borough Hall where the Morris County Freeholders were holding a meeting. The Freeholders decided a few years ago to have meetings in host municipalities around the county in order to take them "on the road" so to speak. This gives residents the opportunity to attend a freeholder meeting locally instead of having to travel to Morristown. The Freeholders thanked us for the use of our Building with a very nice proclamation that is on the Council table to my left and your right. It was a very nice meeting and many nice words were exchanged between some of our residents and the Freeholders. I hope they will come back again in the future.

6/24/10- Attended our monthly meeting of the Mayors Committee for a Green Future in New Brunswick. Good discussion took place about the Sustainable Jersey program and the opportunity that has arisen to propose to the BPU

for the chance to manage a part of the New Jersey Clean Energy Program. This would be a very large undertaking and the fact we were given this opportunity shows what a success the Sustainable Jersey program has been across the state. I am proud of our Green Team that is getting ready to submit for certification. This would enable Mount Arlington to apply for grants to help move forward with green opportunities.

Later that day I JoAnne and I met with a representative to discuss our water and sewer assets to make sure we are managing them to the best of our ability with maximum efficiency and effectiveness.
