

**BOROUGH OF MOUNT ARLINGTON  
COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
JANUARY 15, 2013**

**1. Call to Order**

- 2. Adequate notice** of this meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Arlington was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Notice was published in the Daily Record on December 22, 2012; notice was posted on the bulletin board in the main hallway of the Municipal Building on December 21, 2012 and has been available to the public; notice of this meeting is on file in the office of the Borough Clerk.

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10:4-1 et seq.), the Borough Council opens every public meeting for comments of the public. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 : "Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit the discretion of a public body to permit, prohibit or regulate the active participation at any meeting...."

Speakers at Borough meetings shall have five minutes to present their comments to the Borough Council so as not to consume time that would otherwise be allotted to other persons who wish to speak.

**3. Flag Salute**

Mount Arlington Cub Scout Pack 60 led the flag salute.

The Mayor asked for a moment of silence to remember those who put themselves in harm's way to protect our freedoms, and to pray for relief for those in pain and suffering.

**8. OPRA Report**

The Mayor publicly read any request over the \$100 threshold. The Mayor named one request on December 17, 2012 from M. Weinstein for dog information: Borough cost \$145.00, professional cost \$945.00, total \$1,090.00. The Mayor named another request from B. Barrington for zoning, building and other documentation: Borough cost \$62.00, professional cost \$45.00, total \$107.00. The total year-to-date cost is \$1,295.00. Councilman Sadow stated some parts of the final 2012 OPRA Report were not read into the record due to Council meeting dates. The Mayor named one request on December 4, 2012 from Councilwoman Danchuk for copies of handouts from the November 27, 2012 Council meeting: Borough cost \$59.00, professional cost \$585.00, total \$644.00. Council President Sorge stated Councilmembers can look at documents, listen to tapes, etc., at Borough Hall but in order to obtain and remove copies, an OPRA must be completed. A lengthy discussion followed regarding Councilwoman Danchuk's OPRA requests, her reasons for making such requests, her behavior as a Councilmember, her effect on employees, the cost she is incurring to the Borough and the discussions held during the November 27, 2012 open meeting. Councilman Windish stated under our form of government, a Councilperson has the right to investigate anything but how they use it and what they do with it is a distinctly different issue.

**10. Mayor's Report**

- The Mayor expressed his condolences to the owners and employees of Pub 199 after the tragic fire last week. The Mayor publicly thanked our Fire Department and the fire departments of Budd Lake, Netcong, Roxbury, Jefferson Township and Picatinny Arsenal, along with our Saint Clare's EMT's, and the Mount Arlington Police Department.

**11. Chief of Police Report**

- The December 2012 Monthly Report has been submitted. Chief Licata acknowledged that his staff of 15 used 35 sick days for the year; they are very dedicated to their jobs.

## 12. Municipal Administrator's Report

- There will be a Redevelopment Committee Meeting, Wednesday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, to discuss a potential financial agreement to bring back to the governing body, hopefully at the February 5<sup>th</sup> Council meeting.
- Carolyn Rinaldi is in the process of scheduling a 7:00 p.m., February 19, 2013, Personnel Committee meeting to address updates to the employee handbook; this is an annual process to insure JIIF compliance. That same evening, at 7:30 p.m., there will be a Water Sewer Committee meeting.
- The Boy Scouts are looking for judges for the Pinewood Derby on January 26, 2013; if Councilmembers are available, please contact Carolyn.
- The Recreation Commission met last week and have made some changes, modifications, etc. to their By-Laws, one of which is adding the new AED Laws. The Commission reviews the By-Laws and makes recommendation which are reviewed by the attorney and then presented to the governing body for adoption by resolution.
- John Hudak, Esq., Bond Counsel, will attend a Council meeting in February or March to present an overview of the bond process.
- Received the draft of the Village Center Howard Boulevard Corridor Study from George Ritter, forwarded it to the Land Use Board for review and consideration on their February 27<sup>th</sup> meeting agenda; Land Use will report back to Council.
- Bernd Hefele, Esq., recently sent a letter requesting the Borough vacate Laurel Path; there is documentation on this issue dating back to 2003. Attorney O'Donnell explained this property is between Orben Drive and Rogerene Way, encompasses 4 properties, and the Borough had previously reviewed vacating the property and conveying it to the owners. We will consult with the Borough Engineer as to what steps we need to effectuate, and then the Council can adopt an ordinance vacating the property.

## 13. Council Committee Reports

### Councilwoman Danchuk:

- Nothing to report on Finance. Carolyn Rinaldi stated we will probably introduce the budget in March.

### Council President Sorge:

- Commended the Fire Department and all the neighboring departments on their efforts with the Pub 199 fire.
- Attended the recent Library Board of Trustees meeting.

### Councilman Sadow:

- The Seniors membership is over 200, their trips are well subscribed, their busses are full, and the Club doing well.
- The Finance Committee is looking forward to the presentation by John Hudak, Esq.
- Redevelopment Committee, if all goes as planned, the developer is ready to begin work in early spring.
- Commended Paul Nelson and the DPW for their efforts with the bizarre weather we have been experiencing, and inquired as to the status of construction of the sidewalks on Howard Boulevard to the train station. The Mayor stated Daren Phil had sent a memo to the NJDOT explaining that because of the time lapse, there are additional fees that will need to be paid to the contractor in order to complete the project.
- Asked the status of the claims made/claims paid report regarding employee dental coverage; Carolyn Rinaldi will follow up.

### Councilman Windish:

- Recreation Commission is in the process of reorganizing and reviewing their By-Laws.
- The IT Committee should schedule a meeting; asked Carolyn Rinaldi to obtain "wish lists" from the various departments.
- Councilman Windish had a copy of the Atkins project plans, as approved at the most recent Land Use Board meeting. Councilman Sadow stated that the developer has made it clear that if this is not performed as a PILOT, the project will cease. The Redevelopment Committee is addressing this issue. Councilwoman Danchuk stated the Tax Assessor requested the rental costs; Councilman Sadow stated it was determined approximately \$1,700-\$1,800 monthly rent.

Councilman Sadow stated he would like to revisit the issue of those residents who had previously complained about no access to the sidewalks on the other side of their property and their responsibility to clear the snow; the Mayor stated he would not revisit that issue unless those residents were present at a meeting. Carolyn Rinaldi will confirm the owners of the sidewalks on Howard Boulevard behind the apartments.
