COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES  
MARCH 4, 2014**

**1. Call to Order**

- 2. Adequate notice** of this meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Arlington was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Notice was published in the Daily Record and Roxbury Register on January 2, 2014; notice was posted on the bulletin board in the main hallway of the Municipal Building on December 20, 2013 and has been available to the public; notice of this meeting is on file in the office of the Borough Clerk.

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10:4-1 et seq.), the Borough Council opens every public meeting for comments of the public. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-12: "Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit the discretion of a public body to permit, prohibit or regulate the active participation at any meeting,...."

Speakers at Borough meetings shall have five minutes to present their comments to the Borough Council so as not to consume time that would otherwise be allotted to other persons who wish to speak.

The Mayor asked for a moment of silence to remember all those who put themselves in harm's way to protect our freedoms, and to remember long-time resident and friend John Rinaldi who recently passed.

## 12. Municipal Administrator's Report

- The Mayor requested a Proclamation presentation at the April 1, 2014 Council Meeting honoring Officer Shallop regarding his service during a recent incident.

- Received a formal letter from Saint Clare's; we are on notice of termination of our current agreement and they are making preparing modifications to continue the agreement. As discussed, the Administrator spoke with Saint Clare's and they are prepared to come to a public meeting to discuss this. The school is available and we do have a quorum to hold the meeting on Tuesday, March 11, 2014 at 7:00 pm at MAPS. Representatives from Saint Clare's will be there to discuss their proposals and answer any questions from the Mayor and Council and public. The Mayor explained that Saint Clare's came to us, they are having financial difficulties and are looking to change the program they have in place. The Administrator stated there is currently no change in service. Borough Attorney O'Donnell stated there is a sixty day window that Saint Clare's invoked. The March 11, 2014 meeting will be information gathering, both for the Council and the public. The special meeting will be widely advertised and noticed. Councilwoman Danchuk asked if any of the present developments had agreed to provide their own ambulance services to their residents; the Mayor stated that when New Seasons was built, they were to have a contracted service because we had volunteers, not services from Saint Clare's. When we no longer had EMS volunteer service in the Borough and went with Saint Clare's, Saint Clare's included New Seasons as part of the town. The Mayor stated he would like Saint Clare's to have a separate contract with New Seasons, separate from the Borough. The Mayor stated we are concerned with response time with the new system proposed by Saint Clare's but we will publicly hear what they have to say and make a decision from there. The Mayor stated that one problem with EMS is that the training is very extensive and it is a huge commitment. Councilman Cangiano suggested possibly using the Dial-A-Ride van to assist seniors to get to the meeting; he stated one night of overtime for the driver would not be bad. The Administrator stated we don't have anyone to drive the bus at night but she will attend the Seniors meeting on March 12<sup>th</sup> to convey the information from the special meeting on March 11<sup>th</sup>.

### 13. Council Committee Reports

#### Councilman Stanzilis:

- Attended the Boy Scouts Blue & Gold Dinner, along with Councilwoman Danchuk; seven Cub Scouts crossed over and received the Arrow of Light. Also introduced Patrick Devery from the audience; he received his Arrow of Light last year and is here tonight working on his Citizenship in the Community Merit Badge.
- The Finance Committee discussed the budget with Joe Kovalcik, and discussed the financing for the Succasunna Road project.
- The weather caused many problems for the schools this year; the roof had problems and school was closed February 18, 2014 to remove hazardous conditions. The students are two days over the annual limit; they will add March 10, 2014 to the school calendar.

#### Council President Sorge:

- Thanked DPW and Paul Nelson for their tireless efforts in snow removal.

#### Councilman Cangiano:

- Offered condolences to Mark and Carolyn Rinaldi for their recent loss.
- Expressed congratulations to Mayor Ondish regarding good results on his recent PET Scan.
- Asked status of the budget. The Administrator stated we are waiting for numbers from the State before we introduce, possibly at the April 1, 2014 Council meeting.
- Board of Health is closely watching the Saint Clare's Ambulance situation and asked that we just keep them informed.

#### Councilwoman Danchuk:

- Attended the Boy Scouts Blue and Gold Dinner, where the Scouts were presented with proclamations from Mount Arlington and state legislators.
- DPW is doing great with snow removal. Council did have a resident visit each of their homes with photos and a complaint about snow on his property; the situation was quickly remedied only to find the resident did not own the property in question. This resident had submitted an OPRA request for the Council's email addresses; Administrator Rinaldi explained the website does not include Council's email addresses, only the Mayor's. The phone extensions are attached to Council's email; a voice mail transmits directly to email. We are trying to guide people to email the Clerk's office directly, which is typical for any correspondence addressed to Mayor and Council, then distributed to Council. We will change the Council website page to show Linda and Beth's email addresses.
- The Finance Committee is waiting for the numbers from the state.
- Succasunna Road Committee meeting included about ten residents from Succasunna Road. The Borough Engineer will prepare an estimate of the cost.

### 14. Public Comment

Nancy Absalon, 15 Oak Street:

- Ms. Absalon offered condolences to Carolyn Rinaldi.
- With regard to the Budget, in 1998 the State offered LOSAP for the Fire Departments and Ms. Absalon asked if that could be revisited for our Fire Department; they are volunteers and it would be a type of 401K based on their percentage of calls answered. While we spend money on their training and supplies, that is not for their families and their dedication. Councilman Stanzilis stated Council had talked about a similar program recently, not LOSAP but an incentive program based on the amount of response calls. The Mayor stated many municipalities do this and distribute the money at the Re-Organization meeting.
- Hackettstown Hospital provides ambulatory service, similar to Saint Clare's.

Veronica Silkes, Succasunna Road:

- Ms. Silkes offered condolences to Carolyn Rinaldi.
- The emails that will be directed to the Borough Clerk, in the past, an email addressed to a Councilmember but emailed to the Clerk, the conversation that took place was that it was not her responsibility to forward the emails. Is that policy changing? The Mayor stated that the Clerk is the keeper of all records in the Borough, and any email that comes in, a copy is supposed to be sent to the Clerk for recordkeeping purposes. Ms. Silkes stated that the conversation at the time was that while she was the keeper of the records, it was not her responsibility to forward them. All Councilmembers have Borough email addresses now and residents can be assured that any email to a particular councilperson will be transmitted to them by the Clerk's Office.
- With regard to the Budget, the bond principal this year is \$450,000 that has to be paid back and asked what the interest payment is for this year. The Administrator stated she does not have those numbers with her but she would be happy to give the information over the phone, at any time.
- Ms. Silkes inquired what the initials CDRS stood for; it is Community Development Revenue Sharing. The Mayor explained that the federal government gives the counties money that they break down, review applications and give money to certain projects within the county. We had applied for \$80,000 for a water line by Schmitz Terrace; the county then distributes the money among the municipalities.

Deborah Devery, Patrick Devery, Kadel Drive:

- Mrs. Devery stated that her son, Patrick, is working on his Citizenship in Community Merit Badge and has to follow a Borough issue containing pro's and con's; they thought they would follow the improvements to 404 Howard Boulevard. The Committee has not met yet and Councilman Cangiano stated that 404 has been talked about for at least three years. Councilman Cangiano suggested the following the ambulance issue, this way Patrick can start from next week's meeting and follow the topic from beginning to end.

Wendy Maler, 75 Mountainview:

- Tremendous pothole on Berkshire and Howard Boulevard.
- With regard to recycling, she was under the impression that if everyone faithfully followed recycling, there would be some monetary reduction. The Borough does get money back; the Borough residents are very diligent about recycling.

The Mayor read Ordinance 04-14 by Title.

Councilwoman Danchuk stated that at the meeting we did not have any Board of Education Agenda to refer to; Councilman Windish made a quick comment at that meeting that we are going to change our Agenda to follow the Board of Education.

Councilwoman Danchuk stated it was not a discussion, it was just a statement, "I'm going to change it like the Board of Education", and that was it. The Administrator stated that after the last meeting, the conversation the Councilman brought up would require an amended ordinance to make the changes to the Code; since there was no objection from Council, the ordinance is on for introduction this evening. Matthew O'Donnell stated this is just a format change that Councilman Windish requested. Councilwoman Danchuk stated there was no vote on this; the Administrator stated correct, if there were no objections the amendment would be on first reading at the March 4, 2014 meeting. Attorney O'Donnell stated that if Council wanted any changes to this introduced amendment, they would be discussed at the Second Reading.

***Now, therefore, be it resolved*** by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that March is designated as "Women's History Month". The President is authorized and requested to issue a proclamation each March, calling upon the people of the United States to observe March as "Women's History Month" with appropriate programs, ceremonies, and activities.

***Now, therefore, be it further resolved*** that the Mayor and Council of the Borough of Mount Arlington wish to honor and observe the month of March as "Women's History Month" in the Borough of Mount Arlington.
