Howard Boulevard Sidewalk to New Jersey Transit Station Borough of Mount Arlington

Project Description:

The Borough of Mount Arlington has determined that the pedestrian route from the intersection of Howard Boulevard and Seasons Drive to the Mt. Arlington Transit Station to be a significant safety hazard due to their being no sidewalk improvements along the route. There is also no improved pedestrian route along Howard Boulevard from Seasons Drive to Hillside Drive or from Harrison Way to Lurk Road. The lack of a continuous improved pedestrian route from Lurk Road to Seasons Drive is also a significant safety hazard. The improvements shall include excavation, and the construction of sidewalks along the pedestrian routes described above, as well as other incidental improvements necessary to construct the sidewalk improvements.
