COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES
DECEMBER 18, 2012**

1. Call to Order

- 2. Adequate notice** of this meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Arlington was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Notice was published in the Daily Record and the Roxbury Register on December 22, 2011; notice was posted on the bulletin board in the main hallway of the Municipal Building on December 14, 2011, has been available to the public, and is on file in the office of the Borough Clerk.

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10:4-1 et seq.), the Borough Council opens every public meeting for comments of the public. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 : "Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit the discretion of a public body to permit, prohibit or regulate the active participation at any meeting,...."

Speakers at Borough meetings shall have five minutes to present their comments to the Borough Council so as not to consume time that would otherwise be allotted to other persons who wish to speak.

The Mayor asked for a moment of silence for those that put themselves in harm's way to protect our freedom, for all of our armed forces, and for the horrific events that took place in Connecticut's Sandy Hook Elementary School.

10. Mayor's Report

- Jacqueline Coy has resigned from the Recreation Commission, effective January 1, 2013.
- The Mayor performed a few weddings since the last Council meeting.
- The Mayor stated that he will speak with Paul Nelson regarding converting the Howard Boulevard streetlights to LED lights; the conversion will probably take place after the decorations are removed.
- Due to the fact that the League Convention was cancelled, the Sustainable Jersey Award Luncheon has been rescheduled to January 29, 2013 in Monroe Township. The Mayor invited any Council member to join him, along with any committee members that worked toward this achievement.
- The Historical Society has disbanded, their funds disbursed and the school is the recipient of many of the artifacts, which will be publicly displayed. The Mayor thanked the members of the Society and invited anyone who might like to reorganize another historical society to please contact him.

11. Chief of Police Report

12. Municipal Administrator's Report

- Council had previously requested a Village Core Plan (rezoning of Howard Boulevard) be prepared by Ritter, Plante. George Ritter will be presenting a draft of this plan to the Land Use Board for advisement and then bring it to Council. Carolyn Rinaldi will request copies of the draft for Council.
- Holly Bisson of the Recreation Commission is the coordinator for Fun Day, scheduled for July, 2013 at Firemen's Field. A committee will be formed and listed on the Re-Organization meeting agenda.
- The Recreation Commission submitted a temporary schedule of events for 2013.
- The Borough calendar will be ready for final proofreading this week; we need to add the approved Council Meeting dates (resolution on this agenda) and then it will go to print.

13. Council Committee Reports**Councilwoman Danchuk:**

- Finance Committee held a meeting as they are starting to address the 2013 budget.
- Morris County Flood Mitigation Program has purchased eleven homes in Denville, and there are numerous other applications.
- Open Space Committee: all recommendations were accepted by the Freeholders last week. The smallest but most expensive parcel is less than an acre lot in Morristown, the Harley Street Gardens, and was part of a redevelopment zone.

Council President Sorge:

- Thanked the Fire Department for having Santa on the truck, visiting the entire Borough.
- The Newtown Connecticut school tragedy brought Council President Sorge to tears, and he prays the children are resting in peace.

Councilman Sadow:

- Echoed the sentiments of Council President Sorge regarding Newtown.
- Toys for Tots Drive hosted by Nolan's Ridge was a success; the Marines came to kick-off the Drive and today came to pick up twelve gigantic boxes of toys. Councilman Sadow expressed his thanks to Council for advertising on the Borough signs, and thanked Ridgeview, Lakeshore, Seasons Glen, the post office, the library, and all those that contributed to the process.

- Finance Committee will be addressing the reconstruction and renovation of Firemen's Field, which will be completed hopefully over the next two years. Councilman Sadow would like John Hudak, Bond Counsel, to make a presentation to Council in February or March to give us guidance on how to understand the process and pay for the process. The project will have a life expectancy of about thirty years, with ongoing maintenance issues during that time. In conjunction with the field project and safety considerations, road work at the Altenbrand/Howard intersection will also be addressed.

Councilman Stanzilis:

- Thanked Councilman Sadow for the Toys For Tots Drive.
- The Board of Education received a grant from the Historical Society and students work will be displayed at Acorn Hall at the Morris County Museum for two months. The school Business Administrator Joe Kelley has resigned, leaving mid-January.
- In light of the tragedy in Connecticut, Councilman Stanzilis spoke with Chief Licata regarding security in our schools. Superintendent Jameson posted a letter on the school website outlining the schools security measures that have been in place. The benefit of having our own Police Department is that the Police are right here and always around the schools. Police Chief Licata has posted officers at the schools this week.
- With regard to the recent Police Report, the decrease in overtime is outstanding due to the fact that we now have a full force.

Councilman Windish:

- The Recreation Commission has lost three core members, the president, secretary and treasurer, and will replace these critical positions.

Councilman Gangiano:

- Commended the Fire Department for Santa riding on the truck.
- Commended Chief Licata for initiating the police presence at the schools; this was truly comforting to the parents.
- The Board of Health Re-Organization Meeting is January 8, 2013. The Mayors Wellness Committee is starting a Lifestyle Change Makeover Initiative program to address and help control obesity and diabetes and promote healthier lifestyles. Last year, the Committee had nominal expenses but no vehicle to address these expenses and they are requesting a small amount be budgeted for this Committee. Councilman Gangiano will obtain a more definite amount required and a list of possible expenses.

Councilwoman Danchuk:

- Lake Rogerene resident Maxwell Grant, a student at Roxbury High School, appeared on The Challenge, a high school jeopardy show, to be aired Thursday night, Channel 14, 6:30 p.m. Max was the captain of his team.

Mayor Ondish stated that he spoke to NJ Natural Gas regarding installation on Succasunna Road. NJ Natural gas must acquire a permit from the County to open Mount Arlington Boulevard and once that process is completed, they will start calling people to move forward.

The Clerk stated that the Borough collected 72 coats for the New Jersey Cares Coat Drive.

Veronica Silkes, Succasunna Road:

- With regard to NJ Natural Gas being installed on Succasunna Road, she understood that NJ Natural will bring the line in to the closest point on your house. Personally, her property would be accessed more easily through Lillian. The Mayor is trying to work with NJ Natural to install throughout the town; they will be putting stubs on side roads where many residents desperately want gas as well. Carolyn Rinaldi gave Ms. Silkes the phone number of Bob Gallo, the Borough NJ Natural Gas company contact.
