- Borough Engineer James Landry stated on November 22nd we received a letter from the developer asking for a bond reduction, which supersedes anything that was asked for previously. We had previously disagreed with the developers assessment and outlined the work that needs to be completed and a bond reduction amount; we received concurrence from the developer to proceed forward with this recommendation Friday. Under municipal land use law, from the time I receive the developers' concurrence, I have 45 days to submit the recommendation. If Council feels this should be discussed further, we have time before the next council meeting; Council has the ability to deny the recommendation with cause or approve the recommendation at this point or you can hold your decision to the next meeting.
- Councilman Cangiano stated he reviewed the estimate and understands there are Nolan's Ridge residents that are concerned. Councilman Cangiano would like to table this and see an itemized list of what is being reduced since the last reduction. Councilman Cangiano stated this itemized list would be helpful to the Nolan's Ridge residents, creating a nice transparency for them to review. Mr. Landry said the last reduction was done in March 2015 for Phase I and II, and Phase III was in February 2015.
- Mr. Landry discussed performance and maintenance bonds.
- Council President Sorge stated he would like to see an itemized estimate of work performed and work to be done, and asked to table these resolutions to the January 17, 2017 Council Meeting.

Motion Dismissed: No Vote

The Mayor Opened the Discussion to the Public, with consent of the Council. Steve Wint, President of Nolan's Ridge Association:

- Mr. Wint discussed the problems with landscaping and sidewalks. James Landry stated they identified some sidewalk panels that need to be fixed and the developer has been told informally that this needs to be repaired; landscaping issues will be inspected in the spring. Mr. Landry also discussed issues regarding steep slopes, roads and sedimentation ponds.

Dr. Ken Kappy, Member of Nolan's Ridge Association:

- We have approximately 160 families living in the community, basically a 55+ community, and currently have a lawsuit against the builder of this property. These problems that they are dealing with are not in the Council's domain, but the residents would appreciate any kind of assistance from Council, making sure the construction of these buildings has been appropriately carried out. Dealing with problems regarding water leakage, structural problems, hills, and landscaping. James Landry stated he has looked at the slope and the height of the hill and they are in general conformance as graded but slope stabilization is the concern; the long term solution is planting trees and grass.

Karen Meehan, A&R Managements, Property Manager:

- Managed Nolan's Ridge for 11 years. Ms. Meehan discussed stabilization, landscaping problems and grading issues, stating these are all Borough concerns due to the original plans. Ms. Meehan stated the homeowners are dealing with construction issues which are their responsibility.
- Mr. Landry stated that his recommendation, based on all that was presented this evening, is to table these resolutions to the January 17, 2017 meeting, at which point we will have back-up documentation, we can address questions, so the governing body will have a clearer picture of the request and make an informed decision.
- Councilman Cangiano stated the itemized list should be distributed to the homeowners association and Mr. Landry should meet with them as well to do a more detailed inspection and ascertain what other things have been missed.
- Attorney O'Donnell stated that if Council feels that there is deviation from compliance with the certified plans, they have to make the recommendation that it be referred back to the Land Use Board; it is going to be difficult to comply landscaping this time of year.
