

**BOROUGH OF MOUNT ARLINGTON
REORGANIZATION MEETING MINUTES
JANUARY 4, 2018
7:00 p.m.**

1. Call to Order

2. Roll Call

Councilman Loughridge, Councilman Sorge, Councilman Cangiano, Councilman Windish, Mayor Stanzilis, Matthew O'Donnell, Esq., Borough Attorney, and Carolyn Rinaldi, CFO/Borough Administrator, were also present.

3. Adequate notice of this meeting of the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Arlington was given as required by the Open Public Meetings Act as follows: Notice was published in the Daily Record and the Roxbury Register on December 28, 2017; notice was posted on the bulletin board in the main hallway of the Municipal Building on December 20, 2017, has been available to the public, and is on file in the Office of the Borough Clerk.

In accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act (N.J.S.A. 10:4-1 et seq.), the Borough Council opens every public meeting for comments of the public. However, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 10:4-12 : “Nothing in this Act shall be construed to limit the discretion of a public body to permit, prohibit or regulate the active participation at any meeting,....”

Speakers at Borough meetings shall have five minutes to present their comments to the Borough Council so as not to consume time that would otherwise be allotted to other persons who wish to speak.

We advise all persons, including Council persons, not to discuss in the public portion of this meeting any matter that is pending litigation, on-going investigation of any type of potential litigation, personnel or any comments regarding any Borough employee without given proper Rice Notice.

Council President Sorge thanked the Council for this nomination and hopes this year finds everyone getting along and doing the right thing for the Borough.

11. Mayor's Address

- The Mayor welcomed everyone to the meeting and expressed his appreciation to all who came out in this extreme weather. The Mayor stated he believes the Governing Body and those working for Mount Arlington share a common bond - we are here to serve the people of Mount Arlington.

- The Mayor stated unfortunately this evening Father Murphy could not be here to remind us of who we really serve but Father called the Mayor and asked him to remind everyone that we really do serve God at the end of the day.

- As of this year, the Mayor has one full year of Mayor-ship under his belt and it has been an amazing experience. The Mayor thanked his beautiful wife Laura in the audience for her support. There are strange and interesting things that happen when you are Mayor, for instance, people come knocking on your door. The Mayor shared one story: a while ago a man approached Laura and asked, "Aren't you the wife of that new Mayor?" Laura replied yes and the man said, "Well tell him my daughter was playing in the playground and the bottom of her feet got all black – what's he going to do about it?" Laura replied that she would pass the information on to her husband and it's been that kind of a ride ever since. The Mayor stated Laura has a lot of patience and thanked her again for her support.

- The Mayor publicly recognized Carolyn Rinaldi, our Borough Administrator, whose titles are CFO, QPA, Borough Administrator and she does so much for us. The Mayor stated he knows all of us really appreciate all that Carolyn does. Ms. Rinaldi's leadership role with the Borough staff is exemplary, and the Mayor thanked Linda the Clerk and the entire Borough staff for the amazing work they do. The Mayor stated if we were to look in the dictionary under Customer Service we would see the staff of Mount Arlington.

- The Mayor publicly thanked Police Chief Keith Licata, in the audience, for the amazing work of the Police Department. The entire Police Department is so professional and so dedicated; where do you go where the Police actually know your children's names.
- The Mayor publicly thanked Fire Chief Nick Lima, in the audience, and the entire volunteer department; there is a lot of commitment and an extraordinary amount of time they spend as volunteer firemen.
- The Mayor publicly thanked Paul Nelson, the leader of our DPW Department. Mr. Nelson and his entire team are out plowing and shoveling tonight and they will work until it's done, they don't stop. We have an incredible DPW and we are very blessed to have them.
- The Mayor publicly thanked Tina Mayer and the entire Library staff.
- The Mayor publicly thanked all the volunteers from Recreation and all the various other committees; they give up their free time to make this community a great place to live.
- The Mayor publicly acknowledged our Borough Professionals, Stan, Jessica, Matt, Elizabeth, stating he is surrounded by an amazing group of people, too many to list, but thanked them all for the amazing jobs they do for us; it's a real team and a real family.
- The Mayor publicly thanked the Council who are elected by the people of Mount Arlington, under the leadership of Council President Bob Sorge, for their support and the great work that you do. The Mayor stated he became Mayor unexpectedly and the entire Council has really stepped up and done an amazing job.
- The Mayor stated that this time last year he introduced the concept of Race to the Bottom; the entire Council embraced this concept, and reduced our municipal tax rate for the year 2017 while maintaining, expanding and improving all of our service lines. The Council deserves a round of applause. The Mayor stated he challenges the Council to do it again this year; a repeat of the Race to the Bottom. The Mayor stated it is really impressive that the Council was able to do it and we're going to do it again this year.
- The Mayor listed a few of the accomplishments of 2017: the Borough was awarded almost one million dollars in various grants and awards, some of which was brought on by our new grant writers, Millennium Strategies; almost \$500,000 for the Kadel Drive improvements; \$229,000 for the Fire Department scot packs; police enforcement programs and bullet proof vest funding. Our road restoration projects last year included completion of Kadel Drive, Laurel Path, Seasons Drive, Sandra Drive, McKay Lane, South Glen Avenue, Altenbrand Avenue and Floyd Drive, all without increasing taxes due to sound, conservative fiscal management, which is the mantra that we have had for a number of years. We also implemented the Energy Aggregation Program, generating a cost savings to our residents. The Henry Court and Schmitz Terrace water main improvements were completed. The Borough work on the Community Garden has been completed with the help of a \$20,000 grant, and thank you to Councilman Cangiano for being a big part of getting that done. We are looking forward to opening this Spring, pending the completion of some Eagle projects from Troop 188 that are taking place at the Community Garden. We funded some preliminary engineering costs for capital projects in 2018. Improvements to the Mayor Arthur R. Ondish Memorial Beach will be completed through an Eagle Scout project. Some capital projects for 2018 under consideration are to include but not limited to additional road restorations, water and sewer service expansions, consideration of projects as a result of the work of the Economic Development Committee under the leadership of Councilman Sadow. The Economic Development Committee is something that the Mayor asked the Council to embrace last year, and they did, and they ran with it. Councilman Sadow took leadership on that very seriously and we got a lot done in a year with the charrette, a lot of great ideas and in this year, 2018, the Mayor is looking forward to some of these ideas starting to hatch a little bit. The Mayor stated he would like the Council to look at all our Borough properties

this year, especially some of the properties that are not being used; let's look to see if we can make the best use of these properties, which falls under Economic Development as well.

- One of the most exciting things for the Mayor is that December 19th, 2016, we received a letter stating we were kicked out of the Dover Shared Municipal Court. What were we to do, we had to have a Court by the first of January, 2018. We did it, with the help of Wharton Mayor Chegwidan, Jon Rheinhardt, the entire Wharton Council, our Council, Councilman Delaney and the Court Committee, Carolyn Rinaldi; they worked really hard to put together what some people would have thought impossible but they did it - an entire Court, from scratch, in one year. The Mayor again recognized the Honorable Judge Smith in the audience who will be the Presiding Judge for our shared court. Construction, Land Use and Zoning offices moved up to the DPW building for more efficient use of the space and allowed the Court Offices to be moved to the Borough Hall.

- The Mayor stated we signed a contract to purchase 16 acres of open space land in Lake Rogerene funded by an Open Space Trust award of \$400,000.00. This is the first of its kind in Mount Arlington and will allow us to build an entire set of new trails open to the public; this is to help us protect the vitality of the Lake Rogerene community. We successfully negotiated a four-year police contract and the Mayor thanked Councilman Delaney for taking that lead. We hired additional administrative staff to further enhance our ability to service our residents and again, this is without raising any municipal taxes. We implemented the on-line registration and payment system for Recreation and events. These are the highlights of what we did in 2017.

- For 2018, the Mayor would like to see the Council continue our quest in our Race to the Bottom. The Mayor is confident with this Governing Body, under the leadership of Council President Robert Sorge, they will hit this out of the park and exceed the Mayor's expectations. The Mayor also looks forward to further expanding our Economic Development Committees findings and recommendations under the leadership of Councilman Sadow. One of the things the Mayor would like this year is to improve our bond rating; we have done a lot with reducing debt and he believes if we come in front of Moody's this year for a review, we should have a nice improvement in our bond rating which will help us in a lot of other ways. The Mayor stated we are doing eight to nine more roads this year, to be named soon, and we will do that as pay as we go with cash and grants without issuing any debt. Soon we will be caught up on our road improvements and once that is done, we are going to go into the preventative maintenance phase; spending a lot less money on roads every year which will all trickle down to the bottom line.

- In closing, the Mayor is looking forward to a great 2018. The Mayor thanked everyone for the great work they do serving the residents of our community; and thank God for bringing us all together. God bless you, God bless Mount Arlington and have a great 2018.


